Staci Layne Wilson was born on August 23, 1976 in Los Angeles, CA. She is an American writer and filmmaker. She began as a magazine journalist, then moved on to being a movie reviewer, celebrity interviewer, red carpet reporter, then making short films, helming music videos, and writing and directing features. She has won awards in a number of festival awards.

Psycho Therapy wins two award? Did you expect it?

I was so pleasantly surprised! We made a good film, otherwise we would not have shown it, but we don't go in "expecting" awards. The real reward is crafting something that audiences will enjoy watching, and will talk about later on.

What cinema genre do you prefer?

True crime stories and murder mysteries.

The best and the worst event during a shot

The best thing is when everyone is working together perfectly and each person understands the other. The worst thing is technical problems! (Broken lights, camera battery running low, etc.)

When you shot, are you angry or relaxed?

I am usually relaxed because my goal is to enjoy my work. It's not a job, it's a pleasure

What do you think about cinema

It's very political in the U.S. right now, which can be good – it brings issues to the public's attention. But most of the time I feel that movies should be an escape from the everyday drudgery

Why indie directors have too much difficult to show their works?

I think it's getting better now, with the advent of digital photography and the ease of presenting one's works to the audience.

How is Brooke Lewis during Psycho Therapy?

Brooke was very focused on her performance and making sure she knew what was going on in her character Tonia's mind. That is important, because you can see it in her eyes when she believes she is going through that difficult situation.

My goal is to enjoy my work. It's not a job, it's a pleasure
